Date: 16-02-2024



The seminar's goal was to dissect the rising incidence of PCOD and PMS in young women by educating them about these conditions. The seminar's main goal was to inform and increase young women's awareness of PCOD and PMS. The goal of the seminar was to outline the causes and safety measures that women should take to lead healthy, peaceful lives. The seminar is beneficial for women who experience it. The organizers gave a brief introduction to the seminar at the beginning, emphasizing the significance of understanding PMS and PCOD. She began by outlining the numerous hormones involved in the process as well as the biology of PCOD and PMS. PMDD is a severe form of premenstrual syndrome (PMS) that causes significant distress or impairment in various areas of life due to mood changes and other. She also explained Premenstrual syndrome, or PMS as it is commonly known, is a collection of emotional and physical symptoms that develop in the days preceding menstruation. Polycystic Ovary Syndrome, or PCOD for short, is a hormonal disorder that affects many women who are fertile. It is characterized by polycystic ovaries, excess levels of male hormones, and irregular or prolonged menstrual periods. The speaker also discussed how to properly care for people with PMS and PCOD.The seminar provided the young women with direction and awareness along with the enthusiastic staff members. There was an engaging Q&A session after the seminar. Every participant asked the speaker a variety of questions during the highly interactive session, which empowered and educated everyone.
